From the minister.

A man who was about to become the new head pastor of a successful church decided to find out what his new congregation were like at welcoming the stranger, by dressing up as a homeless person on the day he was to be inducted as the new pastor of the church. He walked around the outside of the building a number of times before entering the church and attempting to engage people in conversation. He was met with stares and avoided by many, and when he attempted to sit near the front of church was firmly but politely asked to move to somewhere near the back. The overall greeting he received was cold and when the service began and strangers to the church were welcomed he was not mentioned. Finally, the stewards announced that they wished to welcome the new head pastor, the congregation applauded loudly only to be stunned into silence as the man they had taken for a homeless man walked to the front of church and shared the following quote from Matthew's gospel: 'Then the King will say to those on his right, "Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me." Then the righteous will answer him, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you a drink? When did we see a stranger and invite him in, or needing clothes and clothed him? When did we see you sick or in prison and go visit you?" The King will reply, "I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me. "The new pastor then shared with the congregation all he had experienced at their hands that morning and many tears were shed as folk realised how poorly they had behaved. We all hope that given the same set of circumstances we would have behaved differently,

but the reality is that all too often we too make snap judgements about others and sometimes treat them in ways that are not gracious, loving or honouring to God. In Lent, as we remember Jesus's ministry on earth we are forcibly reminded that he spent his time reaching out to those whom others often marginalized. The so called upright, 'good' religious people were often scandalised by the company Jesus kept, be they old or young, respected or reviled, poor, outcast, sick or sinful, yet Jesus came to seek and save us all and meet each of us at our point of need, and he calls us, his disciples to follow his example and do the same. Sometimes that requires us to take a step back and examine our lives and our walk with God and one good way of doing that is by going along to a bible study group to share with others, be challenged by and help each other to live for God. This Lent there will be a joint bible study on, 'Back to Basics' looking at three important aspects of Christian life over the course of three fortnights. The sessions will be held at Mount Methodist on Friday mornings, Golcar Methodist on Monday evenings and Outlane Methodist on Thursday afternoons and folk are invited to come to whichever sessions they are able to attend, (see posters for more details). There will also be a joint section service at Lindley Methodist Church on Sunday 14th February which we hope folk will join together and share in as we celebrate God's love on Valentine's day. Finally as we enter February, Mount Methodist will be opening its doors to folk of all ages as it holds its first 'Messy Church' on Saturday 20th February, 4:30pm – 6:30pm. There will be crafts, games, stories and songs as well as a two course meal, all for just £2.50. The event is open to everyone so please share with friends and family and come and support this new venture.
